### In emergencies harm reduction works!

In Ukraine, harm reduction organizations support the community of people who use drugs and Ukrainian people who have fled the war or lost homes:

- by continuing their services. National harm reduction coverage remains the same as in 2021
- by continuing state funding of harm reduction since July 2022
- creating temporary shelters on the premises of harm reduction

Harm reduction in Ukraine and neighboring countries became full-scale shelters - selforganized comprehensive harm reduction enabling evacuation, accommodation of families, food, transport, basic medicine, basic psychological and mental health support




