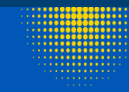

In emergencies harm reduction works!

In Ukraine, harm reduction organizations support the **community of people who use drugs and Ukrainian people who have fled the war or lost homes**:

- by continuing their services. National harm reduction coverage remains the same as in 2021
- by continuing state funding of harm reduction since July 2022
- creating temporary shelters on the premises of harm reduction

Harm reduction in Ukraine and neighboring countries became full-scale shelters - self-organized comprehensive harm reduction enabling evacuation, accommodation of families, food, transport, basic medicine, basic psychological and mental health support

Community Engagement Strategic Initiative:

Short-term Grant Cycle 7 related TA

The main objective of the Strategic Initiative (SI) on Community Engagement is to strengthen the involvement of civil society and communities in the work of the Global Fund and related processes at the national level

Engaging communities and civil society representatives at all stages of the grant cycle is critical to designing, developing and implementing effective responses to the three diseases, and strengthening systems to ensure that Global Fund investments meet the needs of the most affected populations.

Proposed Prioritized TA Tracks and Sub-Activities for NFM4

TA Track A: Situational analysis and needs assessment

- A.1 **CRG-related assessment** (desk review and/or KIIs/FGDs) to generate strategic information for decision-making to inform NFM4 funding request development.
- A.2 **NFM3 program review** to ensure community perspectives inform service delivery improvements under NFM4.

TA Track B: Engagement in NFM4 country dialogue processes

- B.1 Virtual or face-to-face **community consultation(s)** to inform priorities for NFM4 funding requests.
- B.2 **Coordinating input** into NFM4 funding requests and grant-making (e.g. review of draft funding requests or grant-making documents).

TA Track C: Other

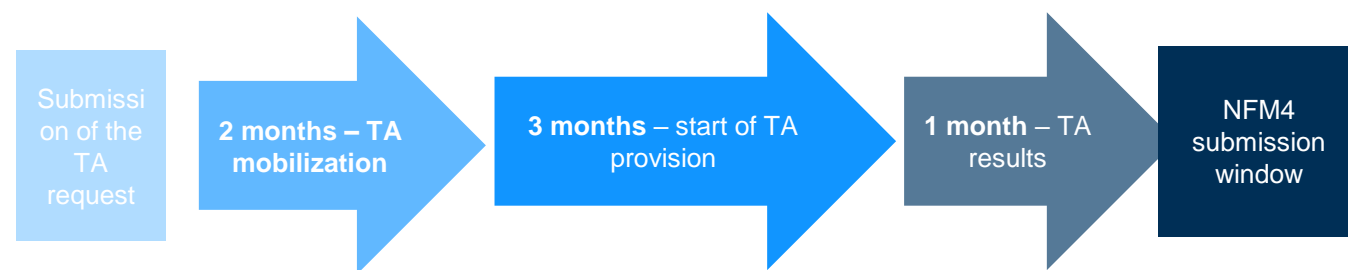
- C.1 **Costing support** (e.g. virtual mentoring or in-country costing support).

When to submit TA requests

Indicative Grant Cycle 7 funding request submission windows (forecast based on NFM3 timeframe - to be confirmed by the end of 2022)	Deadline for submitting CA TA requests (6 months prior to the relevant Grant Cycle 7 window)
Window1 - 31 March 2023 r.	30 September 2022 r.
Window2a - 30 April 2023 r. Window2b - 31 May 2023 r. Window2c - 30 June 2023 r.	31 October 2022 r. 30 November 2022 r. 31 December 2022 r.
Window3 - 31 August 2023 r.	28 February 2023 r.
Window4 - 28 Feb 2024 r.	31 July 2023 r.
Window5 - 30 April 2024 r.	31 October 2023 r.

Please apply for Grant Cycle 7 related CA TA at least 6 months before your country's NFM4 funding request submission windows

- Date X = NFM4 funding request submission window
- Date X minus 1 month – TA Results
- Date X minus 4 months – Start of TA provision
- Date X minus 6 months – Submission of the TA request

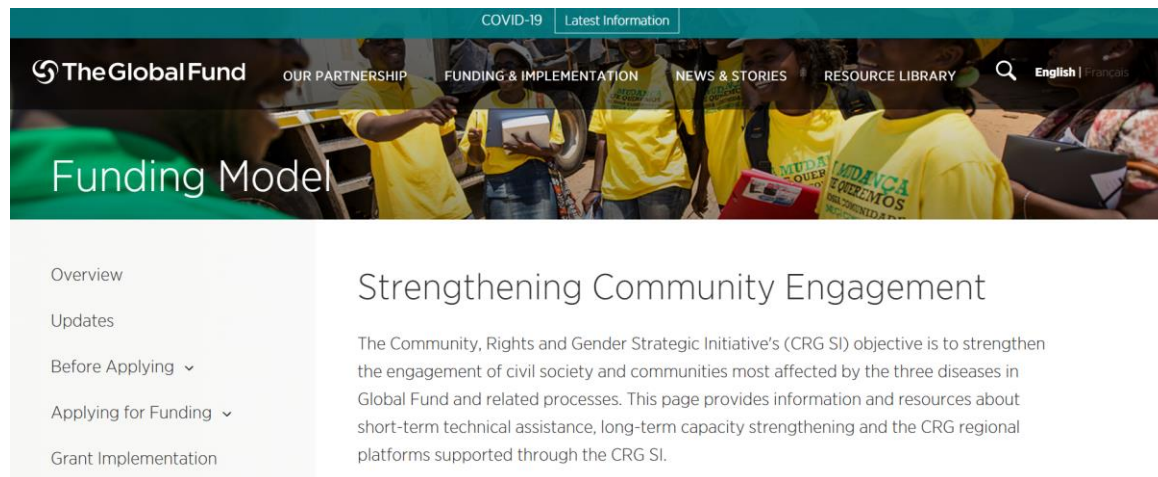
